


Lenten keys.

The dogwood tree, which was said to have been used to make Jesus' cross, is known for its beautiful white and pink blossoms that are usually in ful bloom by Easter.

Legend has it Jesus told the dogwood tree, which then grew as large as an oak tree, because of its shame it would never again grow large enough to serve as a cross. Legend says Jesus instructed the blossoms to grow in the form of a cross, with two long petals and two short ones. In the center of the outer edge of each petal is a design that a

pears to be nail prints, brown with rust and stained with blood, and the heart of the blossom resembles a crown of thorns, which Jesus wore as he hung on the cross.



The Easter Triduum

The term Easter Triduum is the three-day celebra tion of the death and resurrection of Christ-Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday.

On Holy Thursday we remember the Last Supper Jesus gives us the Eucharist and tells us to "Do this in memory of me" He then washes the feet the apostles. On Good Friday we remember the passion and death of Jesus. We calebrate the reurrection of Christ either at the Easter Vigil on Sa
